The DfE allocates funding annually to schools in order to support sustainable development to the quality of PE and Sport provision. The school allocates funding from our core staffing budget to employ 2 sports coaches to teach PE across school and to support the wider staff team where needed. This is a clear reflection of the school's dedication to providing a high level of PE provision for our children. The PE and Sport Premium is used to further supplement PE and sport for children. Children took part in 57 competitions during 2015-16. 59% of the school competed with 75% of KS2 and 59% of children in receipt of Pupil Premium funding taking part 14 children completed the Sports Leaders UK Playmaker coaching award 56 children across KS2 have done leadership work in PE lessons with younger children, at clubs or during the School Games Sports Day (this is 32% of KS2) The school retained its School Games Gold accreditation for the second consecutive year | |
